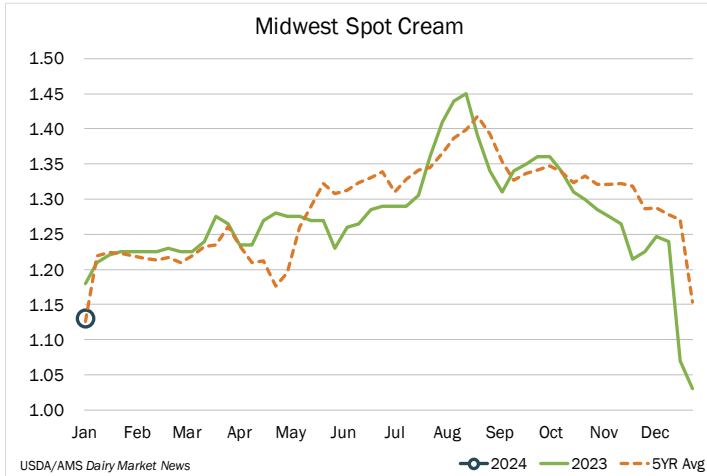
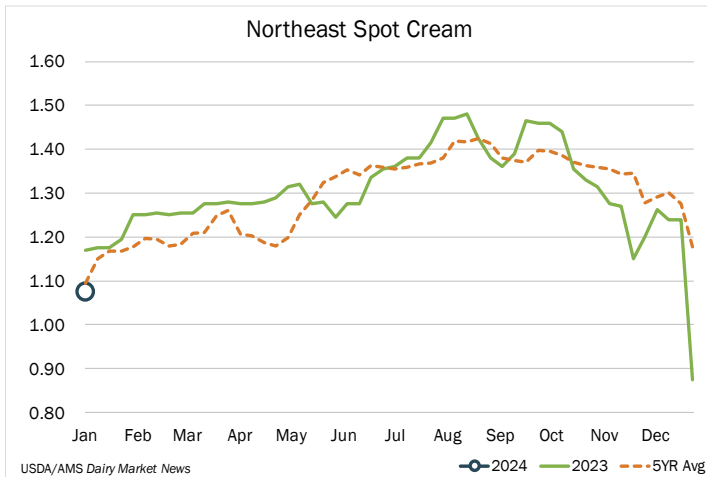

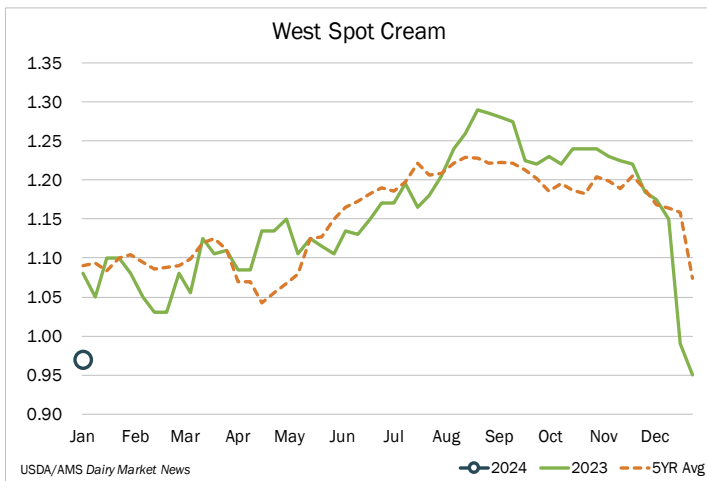

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## Here is what USDA/AMS had to say:

**Midwest:** Cream multiples/prices rebounded in quick fashion following the ample availability throughout the holiday season. Class II and III manufacturing remains quiet, according to contacts, while churners have been running hard over the past three weeks.

**Northeast:** Cream is readily available, and butter churns are running steady production schedules. Cream multiples have returned to the flat market mark as normal operations have resumed in the region.

**West:** Cream is readily available throughout much of the region. Cream demand is steady to lighter. Multiples at the top of the range for all Classes held, while multiples at the bottom of the range for all Classes moved up slightly.
