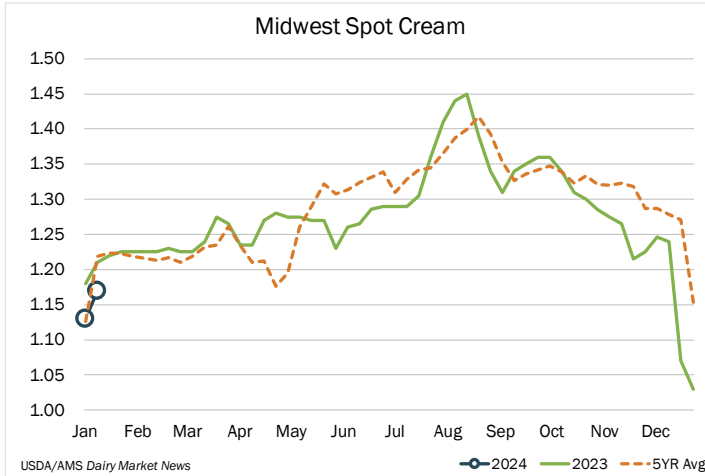
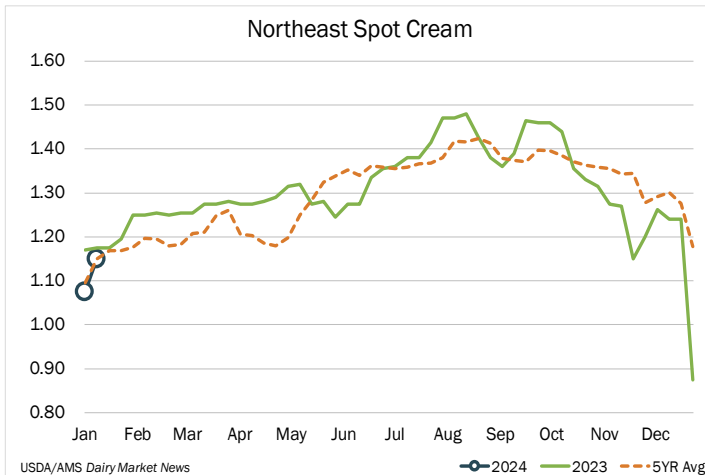

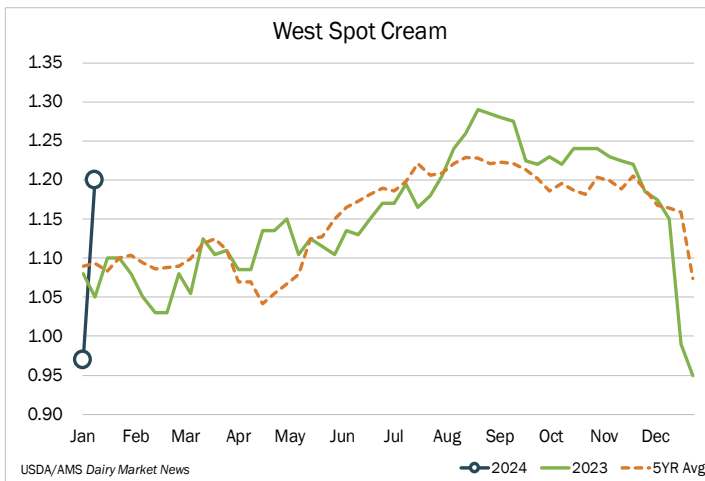

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## Here is what USDA/AMS had to say:

**Midwest:** Cream handlers say ice cream manufacturing remains sluggish. Churns, though, are running actively, with the exception of weather-related downtime. Butter makers say they are turning away cream offers, as they are currently pushing capacity.

**Northeast:** In the Northeast, cream is readily available, and churns are operational seven days a week. In the Southeast, Class II demand is noted to be seasonally steady.

**West:** Cream is a little tighter compared to recent weeks. However, cream remains readily available throughout most of the region. Cream demand is steady. Multiples moved up on both ends of all Classes range.
