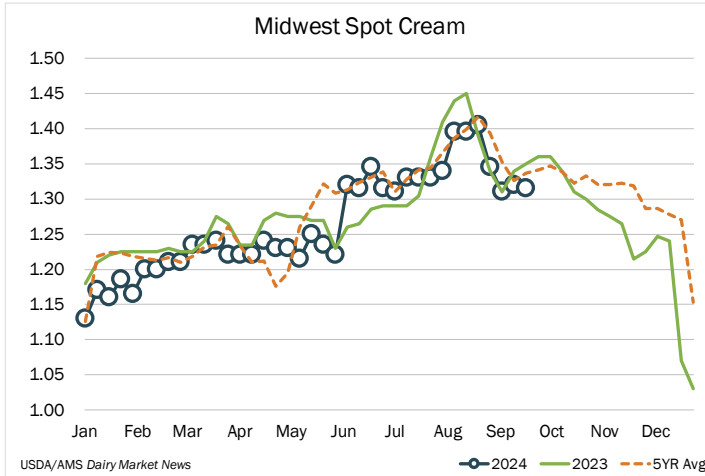


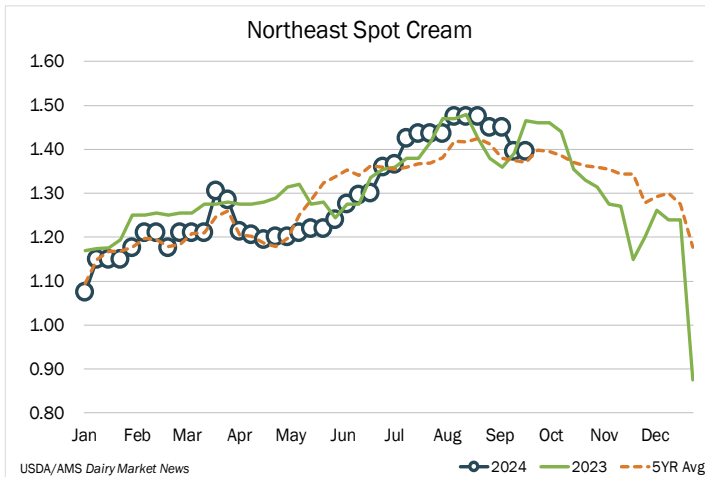

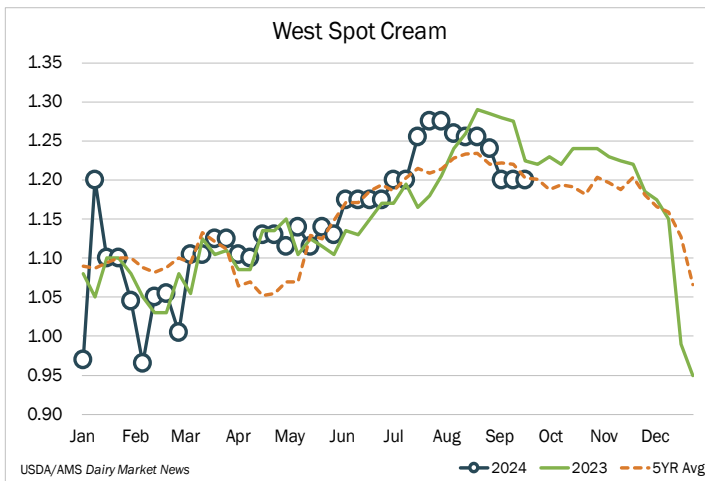

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Here is what USDA/AMS had to say:

Midwest: Cream availability is more clear-cut than spot milk. It remains available for all uses due to Class I spinoff. Butter makers say churning is busier than it was expected to be, and early indications are that next week will hold a similar availability pattern. Cream cheese end users are in their early weeks of ramping up, but current cream stores are plentiful.

Northeast: Spot loads of cream are generally more available than spot loads of condensed skim. The-All Class cream multiples range was unchanged this week.

West: Cream volumes are generally available in the region, more so than other parts of the country. Cream demand varies from steady to lighter. Cream multiples moved slightly lower on the top end of both ranges.
